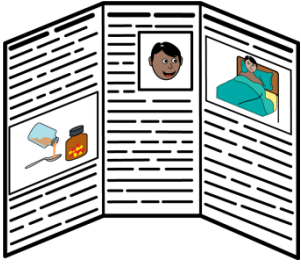


## Consent for Summary Care Record and additional information



Your Doctor has your basic summary care record with information about your health, the medication you are taking and the medication you should not take because it will make you ill (allergic reaction).

A doctor or nurse who doesn't know you very well might ask to look at your Summary Care Record. This will help them to help you.



Only people who look after your health like a doctor or a nurse can see your summary care record.

The Doctor can add important information to your record like when you have been ill in the past and how you were helped (medication, therapy or operations). It can include information about how you like to be supported and by who and help make sure this support is in place for future appointments.

This summary care record, if kept up to date, can help doctors and nurses to treat you well - even if they have not helped you before.



If you would like extra or new information adding to your summary care record because your health and support needs have changed - you can let your Doctor know.

If you don't want your information on your Summary Care record you can ask your doctor to remove it
